Effective Fall 2004**

Program Notes:

1. 3 credits of Economics (ECON 002 or 004) are prerequisites for both BA 250 and MKTG 221.
2. Ultimately, students will have taken 6-7 credits in Business Selections and 12 credits in Support Courses.
3. STAT 100 or 200 or ED PSY 101 needed to meet one General Quantification requirements for all options.
4. Students who have not completed First-Year Seminar may substitute RPTM 230.
