Scheduling patterns for courses not taught each semester: RPTM 476, 490 fall only; RPTM 386, 486 spring only.

Program Notes:

1. STAT 100 or 200 or ED PSY 101 need to meet one of the General Quantification requirements for all options.
2. Students not completing a First-Year Seminar may substitute RPTM 230.
3. Students should take PSY 002 as a social/behavioral Gen Ed class (GS).
4. BI SC 004 must be taken to meet 3 credits of natural science requirements (GN).
